In basketball, her skill and hard work were recognized with awards including 2003-2004 LHS Team Top Rebounder; 2005-2006 LHS Most Valuable Player; 2006 Greater Cleveland Basketball Coaches Association All-Star and two-time All-LEL selection 2003 - 2004 and 2005 - 2006.

Britney was the recipient of the LHS Scholar-Athlete Award for 2003 - 2006.

At Ashland University, where she graduated in 2010 *cum laude* with a B.A. in Sports Management and minors in Marketing and Business Administration, her volleyball accolades as a middle hitter/outside hitter included 2006 National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II Elite 8 Team, 2007 Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Honorable Mention Team, 2007 - 2009 GLIAC Academic Team, 2009 GLIAC Player of the Week, and 2009 GLIAC First Team.

After graduation, Britney went on to work for both the Cleveland Indians (now Guardians) and the Cleveland Cavaliers in hosted events and group sales before pivoting to successful product/project management in the technology startup universe. Britney is currently running operations consulting and management services.

Britney continues to play volleyball via leagues and tournaments in Northeast Ohio.
